From the president ...

Over the past few weeks the face of the MSRT has changed with the election of new officers and with the appointment of new committee chairs. There are many longtime board members who have chosen to take a smaller role in the leadership of this organization. As a result, there are six new board members and 11 board members in new or different positions. As the year progresses I plan to facilitate positive changes in the involvement of the general membership of the MSRT, the utilization of the web site, and the MSRT Bylaws.

The helm of the MSRT has long been in the hands of a few individuals. The past leadership should be commended for the success of this society. At one point in time the Missouri Society of Radiologic Technologists was nearly broke and on the verge of becoming defunct. A few technologists stepped forward to take the lead in bringing the organization out of this very immediate danger. It is those individuals who have continued to serve the society and help it to prosper. I am asking that each technologist steps up to do a small part to continue the success started by those individuals. I need each member to volunteer to serve on a committee. Many technologists have already volunteered at the banquet but we still need your help. I am not asking you to make a lifelong commitment, sacrifice large amounts of your personal time, or even attend any board meetings or the annual conference. What I need are thoughts and opinions. For years each committee has had only one member, the

committee chair. This may be the result of apathy or the inability of committees to effectively communi-

cate. The later excuse is no longer viable with the onset of e-mail. Today serving on a committee can be as simple as being part of an e-mail discussion. Much of the work of committee members can be done via e-mail with very little personal time sacrificed. If you have access to e-mail and can spare a few hours over the course of the year, you can serve on a committee. If each MSRT member

were to participate in this small manner, our society will continue to thrive.

The web site continues to evolve almost daily. Our webmaster, Jerry Green, has created a resource that has proven to be extremely useful. We are only now beginning to realize the possibilities that the Internet offers. It is my goal that the MSRT continue to explore and discuss ways to improve the web site. Increasing the information available to the public and to the MSRT membership may be a portion of these

site. Increasing the information available to the public and to the MSRT membership may be a portion of these improvements. Another change may take the form of increased user friendliness. Ultimately, I would like to see the web site become even more interactive. Again, the MSRT is in need of your help. On the web site each board

members has contact information available. Please take time to let us know your thoughts about the web site or any other issue. Please feel free to contact me about any concerns. With your input, the web site and other functions of the society will continue to evolve to meet your needs.

The third and final goal that I have set for the coming year is to continue to revise the MSRT Bylaws. As many of you know, the Board of Directors offered a few Bylaw revisions for consideration at the annual conference. These changes represented the Board's desire to modernize the Bylaws. This process will continue this year at the October board meeting. During this meeting I hope to discuss and possibly revise the role of student members in the MSRT, the process by which scholarships are given, and a handful of other issues. This organization has done very little to retain student members after they graduate and as a result many recently registered technologists are not members of the MSRT. In addition, the ASRT is moving toward allowing student members to vote and hold office and some MSRT members have voiced a need to follow suit. These are only a few of the items that we hope to address concerning student members. Last year's October board meeting proved to be very fruitful and I anticipate the same results this year.

As a professional organization the Missouri Society of Radiologic Technologists must find ways to enhance the services offered to the membership. As president, I hope to achieve this by improving the participation of members, expanding the web site, and perfecting our Bylaws. All of these changes require your help and input. Please get involved.



Coolidge GE Tube #37721

This "X-ray Tube" was acquired by Henry Y. Cashion, RT(R), the first registered technologist at the Farmington Missouri State Hospital, in 1958. It was found in a scrap pile that was to be dumped. History tells us that this was the first x-ray machine for that hospital, which opened in the early 1900's. It was a used unit, having come from some other Missouri state hospital. Mr. Cashion, a member of the MSRT since 1957, kept it on display in his office over the years. In 2002, at the MSRT annual conference, Mr. Cashion (a life member of MSRT) presented the tube to the MSRT to be used as a fundraiser to support the goals of the MSRT and the profession of radiologic technology.

ASRT JOBCoach gives RTs access to online career management advice

Radiologic technologists have a new tool to help them plan and grow their careers.

The American Society of Radiologic Technologists has added an innovative, customizable job coaching service to its Web site, www.asrt.org. Called ASRT JobCoach, the service offers advice for every stage of a radiologic technologist's career, from writing a résumé to interviewing for a job to negotiating a raise.

"The ASRT JobCoach is a comprehensive knowledge base of career information, multimedia tools and professional services that radiologic technologists can tailor to meet their needs," said ASRT Vice President of Business Development Keith R. Chamberlain. "The goal of the JobCoach is to support technologists in their pursuit of personal and professional development by providing critical career services," he added.

The ASRT JobCoach is the result of a partnership between the ASRT and MyJobCoach Inc., a company that offers interactive, personalized career development services via the Internet or by telephone.

Many ASRT JobCoach services are provided free to technologists, while others are available for a fee.

Free services include the "AskCoach" area, where radiologic technologists can read advice on more than 500 subjects ranging from how to prepare for a performance review to how to maintain a comfortable balance between work and life. The information in the "AskCoach" section is written by career experts such as Alesia Benedict, former president of the National

Association of Résumé Writers; Martin Yate, author of the bestselling *Knock 'Em Dead* job hunting books; and Peter Goodman, author of *Win-Win Career Negotiations*.

If site visitors don't find an answer to their careerrelated question in the "AskCoach" section, they can submit their question by e-mail and receive an electronic response.

Another free service is the JobCoach's behavioral style summary, a unique tool that describes how an individual responds to and interacts with others. Site visitors complete a 10-minute questionnaire that reveals their preferred work style, their ideal work

style and how coworkers perceive them. "This information can help radiologic technologists understand their strengths and how they contribute to an organization," said Mr. Chamberlain.

For radiologic technologists who want to receive personal job counseling, the site features several fee-based services. Technologists can take advantage of a professional résumé writing service, sign up for one-on-one telephone consultation sessions with a job coach, receive an in-depth salary analysis report, or arrange to have their résumé distributed electronically to key recruitment firms. "You can even hire a reference-checking firm to find out what the people you've listed as references on your résumé say about you," said Mr. Chamberlain. Fees for these services range from \$14.95 to \$495, with ASRT members receiving up to a 20 percent discount on coaching services they use.



ASRT web site features new 'tool kit' of tips, statistics to help recruit, retain radiologic technologists

A teenager in Texas is trying to decide whether to become a radiologic technologist. A radiology department manager in Ohio is struggling to reduce employee turnover. A radiologic technologist in Idaho is wondering how to advance in her career.

What do they have in common? They all want accurate data on the radiologic technology work force, reliable information to help them make decisions, and real-world advice to guide them along the way. And now, they all can find the answers they need in the Recruitment and Retention Tool Kit, a new addition to the ASRT Web site.

Available at www.asrt.org, the Tool Kit is a collection of the latest statistics, useful tips, case studies and how-to information on the topics of recruitment and retention. The materials are tools that the radiology community can put to work immediately, says ASRT President Allen Terrell, M.S., R.T.(R)(MR).

"Of the many challenges facing health care today, the shortage of radiologic technologists is certainly one of the most critical," says Terrell, who says radiologic technologists are the scarcest of all hospital staff. A highlight of the Tool Kit is five streaming video segments that describe educational options and career opportunities in radiography, sonography, nuclear medicine and radiation therapy. The videos follow a group of radiologic science students from the classroom to the clinic. As they interact with teachers, mentors and patients, students explain why they chose to become radiologic technologists and discuss the benefits and rewards of the career. Other information in kit is organized into six sections:

- Recruitment
- Resources
- Retention
- References
- Regulations
- Profiles

Case studies describing successful recruitment and retention strategies also are presented throughout the Tool Kit.

"The Tool Kit offers hundreds of pages of advice, ideas and data that anyone can use to help design and implement a recruitment or retention strategy," says ASRT Chief Executive Officer Lynn May. "It is a rich resource of information on the profession, whether you're looking for supply and demand data, salary averages, career descriptions, retention strategies or demographic information about radiologic technologists."


